

Frontline programs that are not suitable for this paper:

Close to Home (very limited scope)

Dancing Boys of Afghanistan (content limited and slanted)

Dreams of Obama (biography only)

God in America (history only)

Growing Up Online (information is too general; *Digital Nation* is OK)

The Last Abortion Clinic (content is outdated)

The Meth Epidemic (content is outdated)

The Mormons (history only)

Opium Brides (content limited and slanted; only 32 minutes)

Poor Kids (too few samples to support a valid conclusion)

The Pot Republic (only 25 minutes)

Two American Families (too few samples to draw a valid conclusion)

TB Silent Killer (presentation of case histories rather than investigative)

Any program under 40 minutes is not suitable.

Frontline programs with other concerns but that can be used for this paper:

When Kids Get Life (New laws enacted after the documentary aired obviate a thesis to the effect that laws governing prosecution of minors should be changed.)

American Porn (This program is apparently no longer available. If it is made available again, make sure that your thesis reflects the content of the program, the economic aspects of the issue; do not write a paper about the moral issues involved, whether or not you think porn should be legal, or something similar.)

Medicating Kids (2001) (This program must be combined with the updated program *The Medicated Child* which aired in 2008.)
